## Bressingham and Fersfield Parish Council

### Minutes of the Meeting held on the 6<sup>th</sup> of August 2018

The meeting opened at 7.15 p.m .

#### **Present**

Councillors – Chair, Mr R Hewitt, Mr D Hodges, Mr R Spall and Mr J Kemp.

Also present were several members of the public and the clerk Mr M Mortimer.

#### **1 Apologies**

Mr D Neville and Mr K Traynier

#### **2 Declarations of Interests**

There were none.

#### **3 To agree the minutes of the meeting of the 2<sup>nd</sup> of July**

The minutes were agreed and signed.

#### **4 Matters arising from the minutes**

Mr Kemp pointed out that there was still damage to School Road, The clerk reported that Highways were in the process of establishing a cost for the concrete bases for litter bins on the A1066. Mr Hewitt informed councillors that those concerned had been made aware that £100 was available to each of the two recreational areas for maintenance.

#### **5 Farm and Heavy Traffic**

Mr Hewitt explained that there was activity regarding the Inspector's report on the Ash Tree Farm development,

#### **6 Planning**

Mr Hewitt reported that the High Oak development would now be considered by the full committee.

#### **7/9 Armistice Centenary and Airfield Memorial (considered jointly)**

Mr Hewitt outlined the current plans for the centenary event. Mr Spall asked if road closures would be necessary. Mr Hewitt felt that it was unlikely but was unable to say until there was some idea of numbers.

Mr P Davey was asked to introduce the Airfield Memorial item. He explained that the wartime airfield at Fersfield was the only one without a memorial and that there was considerable local feeling that there should be one. He asked if a committee with the support of the PC could be set up to pursue the matter including finding the funds. The PC agreed to provide an initial £250 and Mr Davey agreed to take things to the next stage. He pointed out that requirements regarding a site, access, parking and so on were already in place. Mr Kemp suggested that it would be useful in raising further interest if reference was made to the idea at the Armistice event.

#### **8 Allotments**

Mr Kemp reported that he had been invited to an AA meeting next week where he hoped a satisfactory outcome to the poly tunnel issue could be resolved.

#### **10 Any Other Matters**

Mr Hewitt commented on the speedy response from UK Power Networks to complaints about trees fouling cables.
